ARL STOP Program

Do you have a cat or a pit bull that needs to be spayed or neutered but can't afford the cost? The Animal Refuge League's Low Income Spay & Neuter Program may be able to help you and your pet. If you qualify, we will issue you a certificate to have your pet to be spayed or neutered at a local participating veterinarian's office for a discounted rate. HELP! FIX ME Maine's Low Cost Spay/Neuter Program

Cat fixed for \$10, dogs \$20. You may be eligible for the state's low-cost spay/neuter program, if you receive or are eligible for one of the following programs: Food Stamps, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Social Security Disability (SSD), and/or Maine Care (Medicaid). If you can't afford to fix your cat or dog, call 1-800-367-1317 or (207) 287-7621.

Spay Incentive Certificate

The Greater Androscoggin Animal Shelter provides discount spay certificates to individuals who bring litters of puppies or kittens to the shelter if they still have the mother. The owner of the mother is issued an Incentive Certificate (Cats \$75, dogs \$125) to be used at an area veterinarian.

Neutering Discount Assistance

The Greater Androscoggin Humane Society has funds available to offer neutering assistance to families in financial need. Please call or drop by the shelter (207-783-2311) to see if you qualify.

Help with Emergency Veterinary Care:

THE PET FUND: Provides financial assistance to owners of domestic animals who need urgent veterinary care. The Pet Fund also provides information about preventative care, pet insurance programs, and financial services that will ensure that pet owners are able to develop financial resources on their own and thus avoid future emergencies through care and planning. FELINE VETERINARY EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM: Provides assistance to cat/kitten guardians who are unable to afford veterinary services to save their companions when life-threatening illness/injury strikes. STARFLEET CANINE AID FOUNDATION: SCAF was created to provide financial aid to owners or rescue organizations that could not otherwise afford medical treatment for the curable disease or recoverable accident of a canine companion. <http://www.canineaid.org>

IMOM: Dedicated to better the lives of sick, injured and abused companion animals and to insure that no companion animal has to be euthanized simply because their caretaker is financially challenged. Allows owners to fundraise for their pets' care via their website. Also has limited funds for emergencies, blind dogs, diabetic pets, and those with chronic renal failure. <http://www.imom.org>

LABMED: Will provide monetary assistance toward emergency medical expenses for Labrador Retrievers who are abandoned or in a rescue situation and for whom no other funding is available or is insufficient. <http://www.labmed.org>

LABRADOR LIFE LINE: Aids purebred Labrador Retrievers in need of new homes, urgent medical care, or other assistance in order to live a full and productive life. Provides assistance to dogs: (a) currently in or will be placed in rescue situations; (b) dogs currently at shelters with whom LLL has a current Memorandum of Understanding; (c) dogs who are with families, but for valid reasons, the family cannot provide the required help for the dog's condition. <http://www.labradorlifeline.org>

GOLDSTOCK FUND: The Fund's mission is to provide funds to rescue organizations or individuals to pay for transportation, boarding, evaluations and medical costs of golden retrievers and golden hearted dogs taken into rescue.
